



Malcolm, Bridget, James & Matthew's Christmas 2017 Newsletter



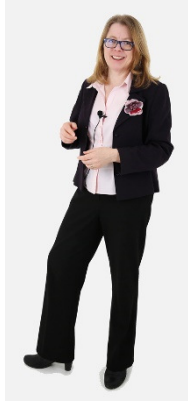
James

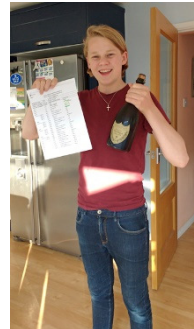
Malcolm
